You've heard the old saying: "Birds of a feather flock together"? Well, the same is true when they gather on wires—that is, before they get zapped and fly away.

By drawing and placing bird tiles or playing zap tiles, players arrange birds into sets on their power lines trying to create the best scoring combinations. But watch out! In this game of migrating birds and power zaps, scores go up and down and you never know if your score is the highest until the very end.

This game has two sets of rules, one for families with young children (7 +) and one for more advanced, challenging play. This is a delightful and deceptively simple game for kids and families that will keep them up way past their bed time!
